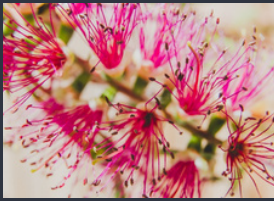

NTI have recently launched a second option for studying with us, without enrolling in a full course.

Single subject NO ASSESSMENT (Auditing)

- Ideal for students to undertake study without the pressure of assessments.
- Students can attend classes, access all learning materials and take part in all learning activities
- Students will receive a Certificate of Attendance

Single subject enrolment - with assessment

- Ideal for students who wish to experience postgraduate study before committing to a full course
- Students complete all assessments, receive formal feedback, marks and final grade, and have their results recorded for subject credit points.
- Students will receive a Certificate of Attendance and Academic Transcript

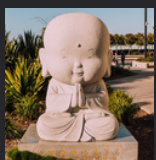
